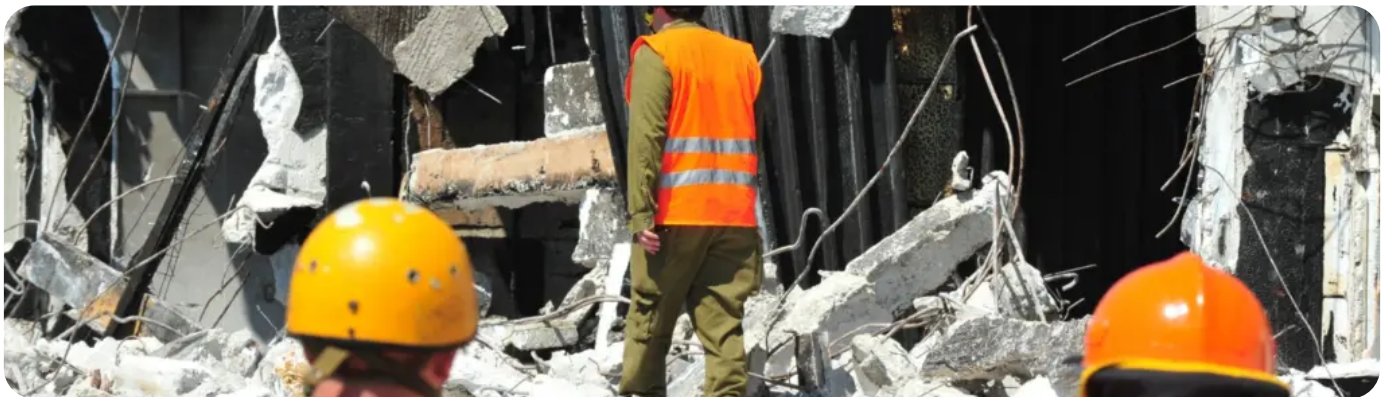

Overview

Intermediate Incident Command Systems for Expanding Incidents (ICS 300) provides training and resources for personnel who require advanced application of the Incident Command System. Building on foundational ICS knowledge, the course enhances incident command skills and focuses on concepts applicable to individuals directly responsible for emergency response at offshore or onshore company assets requiring offsite IMT support.

The course is focused on expanding incidents and includes intermediate understanding of ICS and National Incident Management System (NIMS) principles, NIMS command and management, incident/event management for supervisors, Incident Action Plan (IAP) development, and incident management on a simulated incident.

Training is delivered in a classroom and Emergency Command Centre (ECC) environment, with group activities covering the development of the Incident Action Plan and the interaction between Command and General Staff sections. Post-exercise debriefs provide immediate feedback on individual and team performance.

Certification Variant

This course is available as a PT Samson Tiara certificate course, a TEEX-approved course, or an NOCN-certified course delivered in partnership with Wild Geese Group. The syllabus and teaching materials are the same across all certification variants.

Who is it For?

This course is intended for personnel who require intermediate or advanced application of ICS during expanding incidents, including:

- Incident Management Team members
- Emergency Management Team members
- Crisis Management Team members
- Supervisors involved in incident or event management
- Personnel responsible for emergency response at onshore or offshore company assets
- Personnel involved in Incident Action Plan development
- Personnel working with Command and General Staff functions

Course Delivery

The course is delivered over **2 days** in a classroom and ECC environment. Training includes classroom instruction, group activities, IAP development exercises, simulated incident management activities, and post-exercise debriefs.

The maximum number of delegates listed for this course is **14 participants**.

Learning Objectives

Upon completion of the course, delegates should have an intermediate understanding of ICS and NIMS principles and be able to apply ICS concepts to expanding incidents in industrial, offshore, or onshore company asset environments.

Delegates will develop knowledge and practical capability in:

- Applying ICS and NIMS principles to expanding incidents.
- Understanding NIMS command and management at expanding incidents.
- Managing incident/event processes from a supervisor-level perspective.
- Developing and using an Incident Action Plan.
- Understanding the interaction between Command and General Staff sections.
- Managing a simulated incident in a classroom and ECC environment.
- Receiving and applying feedback from post-exercise debriefs.

Course Content

- Intermediate Understanding of ICS and NIMS Principles
- NIMS Command and Management at Expanding Incidents
- Incident/Event Management Process for Supervisors
- Incident Action Plan (IAP) Development
- Incident Management on a Simulated Incident

- Command and General Staff Section Interaction
- Classroom and ECC-Based Group Activities
- Post-Training Assessment

Assessment

The course includes post-training assessment and post-exercise debriefs. Group activities and simulated incident exercises provide opportunities for feedback on individual and team performance.

Prerequisites

This course builds on foundational ICS knowledge. Delegates should have prior exposure to ICS principles or relevant incident management responsibilities before attending ICS 300.

Certificate

Delegates who successfully complete the course will receive certification according to the selected course variant:

- **PT Samson Tiara variant:** PT Samson Tiara certificate of completion.
- **TEEX variant:** TEEX-approved certificate, with PT Samson Tiara course completion documentation where applicable.
- **NOCN variant:** NOCN certificate delivered through the approved Wild Geese Group partnership arrangement, with PT Samson Tiara course completion documentation where applicable.
